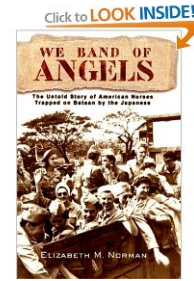

**“We Band of Angels”

We Band of Angels is the untold story of American women who were searching for adventure and romance at the end of the Great Depression. The women volunteered for overseas peacetime duty in the Philippines as military nurses and set sail for a tropical paradise. Their short work days began with a houseboy delivering the newspaper and some fresh-squeezed papaya juice; and ended with cocktails and a game of bridge in the serene South Pacific sunset. This idyllic life changed on the same day the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor. The Japanese Imperial Army also struck American bases in the Philippines. That raid led to the first major land battle for America in World War II and, in the end, to the largest defeat and surrender of American forces.

Ninety-nine Army and Navy nurses, as well as some civilian nurses, lost their paradise and found themselves as the first unit of American nurses to be thrust into the battlefields of World War II. Nothing in their nursing experience prepared them for the daily slaughter of war, tending to wounded and dying while bombs fell around them and the enemy closed in with no reinforcement in sight. The nurses remained at their posts and tended to their patients in open jungle hospitals, adapting their standard practices from routine surgical care to combat triage with no formal military training. After four months of intense fighting, the Allied Forces, who did not have enough medicines, food, supplies, or equipment, faced defeat and surrendered. All of the nurses left Bataan the night of surrender for Corregidor, but in the weeks ahead, only 22 nurses were able to flee to safety in Australia. The remaining nurses surrendered on Corregidor on May 6, 1942, becoming part of the largest group of American women in our country’s history to be captured and imprisoned by an enemy. This is their story: a tale of endurance, courage, bravery, unwavering dedication to their profession, and a breathtaking study of group strength.
