



CLERK OF THE YEAR AWARDS

The Michigan Association of Municipal Clerks awards three (3) prestigious annual awards to clerks who have shown exceptional personal and professional qualities working as a City Clerk, a Township Clerk, or a Village Clerk. Nominations for these awards are made in March of each year. A nomination questionnaire is mailed to each candidate whose name has been submitted for placement on the ballot.

Past award recipients review the applications and the questionnaires submitted by the deadline and propose a ballot of nominees for each of the three awards. Nominees who are placed on the ballot are selected based upon criteria which evaluates the nominees years of experience; above average competence in the position; active participation in county, state, national or international associations; a demonstrated interest in improving the profession; a demonstration of development of personal and professional skills, and a record of contribution to the betterment of their representative community. The nominee must be a member of the Michigan Association of Municipal Clerks (MAMC). A Ballot is mailed to all Clerks on the MAMC membership list. There is one vote per jurisdiction. A Deputy Clerk may vote in place of a Clerk with a proxy given by the Clerk of the respective jurisdiction. Only ballots returned by the deadline will be counted.

The prestigious award for City Clerk of the Year, Township Clerk of the Year, and Village Clerk of the Year are presented at the Annual MAMC Conference in June.
